CE Instructions

Kappa Psi Pharmaceutical Fraternity, Inc. is pleased to offer continuing education credits at the 60th Grand Council Convention (GCC) through a joint provider, University of the Incarnate Word (UIW) Feik School of Pharmacy (FSOP). Administration of CE is handled through the online CE management program Learning Express CE (LECE). Access to LECE is through this link: <u>https://uiwfsop.learningexpressce.com/</u>.

Through LECE, licensed pharmacist attendees will register for the GCC to complete the post-test and session evaluation, utilizing the CE "Access Code" provided by the session speakers at the end of each session. This code is necessary to complete the post-test and the session evaluation in LECE. Participants must attend the entire CE activity to receive credit. Upon earning ≥70% on a post-test and completing the session evaluation, LECE will transmit the CE credit information to the regulatory bodies at NABP and ACPE. CE credit will be reflected in CPE Monitor[™]. A certificate of CE credit may be printed through LECE or CPE Monitor[™]. Attendees will have six weeks to complete the post-test and session evaluation for CE credit. **The deadline to submit the post-tests and session evaluations to obtain CE credit is Thursday, September 1, 2022.**

Attendees must verify that their NABP e-Profile ID and birthdate (in MM/DD format) are correctly entered into LECE and correspond with their NABP record. Failure to ensure this information is identical in both programs may result in no CE credit awarded. How to Access/Manage Learning Express CE:

- 1. Login at: <u>https://uiwfsop.learningexpressce.com/</u>.
- 2. Create an account with Learning Express CE. Be sure to include your correct NABP e-Profile ID and birthdate in MM/DD format.
- 3. Select "2022 Kappa Psi 60th Grand Council Convention" under the Live programs tab.
- 4. Click on the dates to view a list of the program sessions with CE credit.
- 5. Click in the box in front of the sessions you attended. Once selected, scroll to the bottom of the screen and click on the green "Register Now" button.
- 6. Enter or confirm your profile information, confirm your session selections, and click on the blue "Register" button.
- 7. Click on the green "Take the Test" button for each session.
- 8. Your will be prompted to enter the "Access Code" that was provided by the speaker at the end of their session.
- 9. Complete the post-test. Note that you must score \geq 70% on the post-test to move on to the evaluation.
- 10. After completing the post-test, select the green "Click here to complete an evaluation" button.
- 11. Once you have completed the evaluation, click the blue "Submit" button. At this point, your data is transmitted to NABP and ACPE. This credit will now be reflected in your CPE Monitor[™].
- 12. After completing the evaluation, you are taken to a screen where you can print the CE Statement of Participation.
